## Birds Australia

The *Handbook of Australian, New Zealand and Antarctic Birds* (HANZAB) is being produced by Birds Australia (the Royal Australasian Ornithologists Union). HANZAB is an integral part of the mission of Birds Australia, which is to work to conserve native birds and biological diversity in Australasia and Antarctica, through the study and management of birds and their habitats, and the education and involvement of the community. HANZAB provides an authoritative and scientific base for making decisions about our avifauna and for the directions of future research.

### BIRDS AUSTRALIA

Birds Australia (the Royal Australasian Ornithologists Union) is Australia's oldest national conservation organization and the best established in the field of bird research. Since its foundation in 1901, Birds Australia has provided a focus for researchers, both amateur and professional, working to increase our knowledge of the birds of Australasia. Scientific data are essential to making informed decisions about the management and conservation of birds and their habitats. To this end, as well as HANZAB, Birds Australia co-ordinates the New Atlas of Australian Birds, the national Nest Record Scheme, and many study programs of threatened and endangered birds and their habitats. The RAOU is consulted regularly by government organizations, companies, educational institutions and individuals.

Birds Australia has now produced four volumes of HANZAB, and publishes *Emu*, a quarterly scientific journal and Australia's only internationally recognized ornithological journal. Birds Australia also publishes *Wingspan*, a quarterly magazine for all members, *Birds Australia Conservation Statements*, the *Birds Australia Report* series and *Birds Australia Monographs*. HANZAB continues Birds Australia's achievements in publishing: *The Atlas of Australian Birds*, *Shorebirds in Australia* and *Threatened and Extinct Birds of Australia*.
